



Getting your COVID-19 vaccine if you do not have a Medicare card, or you do not have a valid visa

[COVID-19 vaccines](#) are free for everyone in Australia regardless of Medicare or visa status.

If you don't have a [Medicare card](#), are not eligible for [Medicare](#), or if you don't have a valid visa, you can still get your free vaccination at:

- a Commonwealth Vaccination Clinic
- a state or territory vaccination clinic

The vaccine is voluntary, but everyone is strongly urged to get a vaccine to help protect the community from COVID-19.

If you are not eligible for Medicare, providers can still supply COVID-19 vaccines to you. You will not be billed for this service. The vaccine will be delivered free of charge.

Getting proof of your COVID-19 vaccination without a Medicare card

If you don't have a Medicare card, or are not eligible for Medicare you can get proof that you have had your COVID-19 vaccination by:

- Asking your vaccination provider to **print a copy** of your [Immunisation History Statement](#) for you
- Calling the [Australian Immunisation Register](#) to have an Immunisation History Statement **sent in the post**. It can take up to 14 days to arrive.
